



JEL Classification System / EconLit Subject Descriptors



General Categories

- Developed for use in the Journal of Economic Literature (JEL)
- A standard method of classifying scholarly literature in the field of economics
- Used to classify articles, dissertations, books, book reviews, and working papers in EconLit

- A General Economics and Teaching
- B History of Economic Thought, Methodology, and Heterodox Approaches
- C Mathematical and Quantitative Methods
- **D** Microeconomics
- E Macroeconomics and Monetary Economics
- F International Economics

JEL Classification Codes Guide



 The guide provides JEL Code application guidelines, keywords, and examples of items within each classification.

A10 General

A11 Role of Economics; Role of Economists; Market for Economists

A110 Role of Economics; Role of Economists; Market for Economists

Guideline: Covers studies about issues related to the role of economics and economists in general. Also includes studies on the labor market for economists.

Keywords: Economists

Caveats: Studies about the market for economists may also be classified under J44, if they are of general relevance to professional labor markets.
